PRICE STATISTICS – MONTHLY PRICE TRENDS

Price collection is one of the important tasks being attended by the Directorate of Economics & Statistics. The importance and usefulness of the information pertaining to the price movements has much significance in the context of controlling prices to avoid exploitation of adverse conditions.

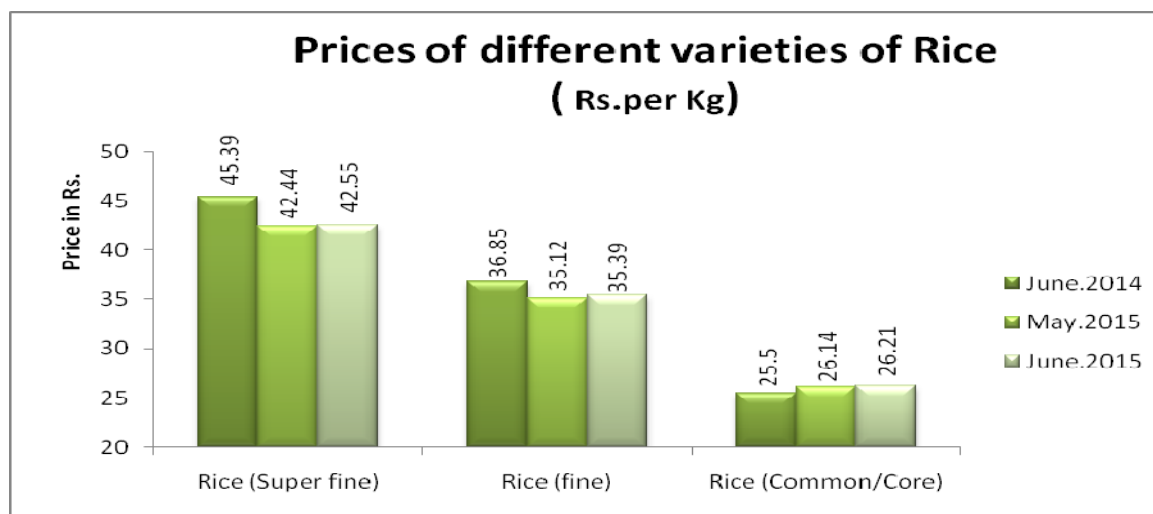

1.RICE (OPEN MARKET)

Comparison of State average retail prices of different varieties of Rice

During the month of **June.2015** a marginal decrease was noticed in the State average retail prices of items in the group when compared with the prices of the previous month **May.2015**. The prices of Rice super fine , fine and Rice Common slightly increased by 0.26% ,0.77% and 0.27% when compared with the previous month **May.2015**. When compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, State average retail prices of Rice common variety has increased by 2.78% where as the price of Super Fine Variety and Fine variety marginally decreased by 6.26% and 3.96% . The prices and percentage variation over the previous month and year of Rice are presented in the following table and diagram.

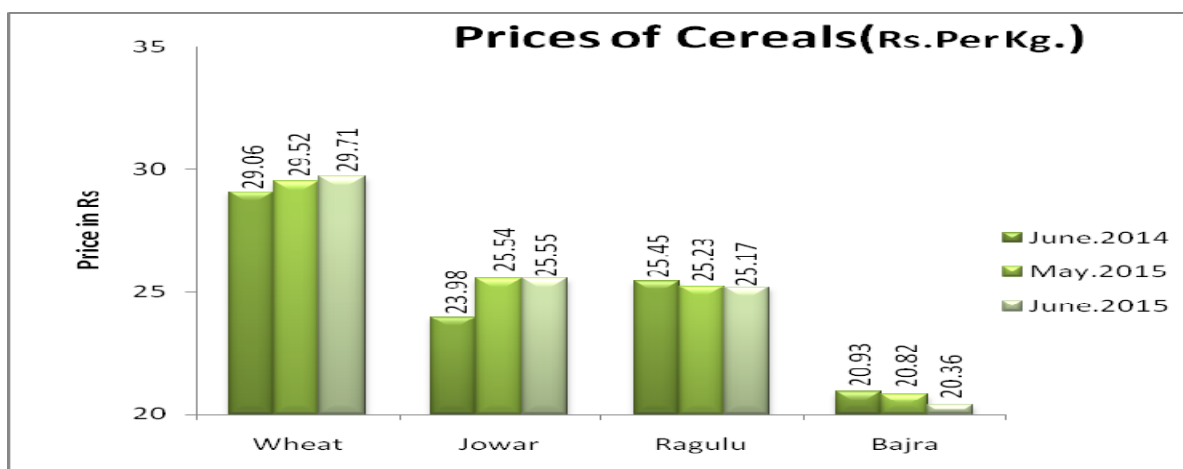
2.Cereals

Comparison of State average retail Prices of Cereals

During the month of June.2015, a slight decrease was noticed in the state average retail prices of Bajra (2.21%) & Ragulu(0.24%) and a slight increase was noticed in the state average retail prices of wheat (0.64%) & Jowar (0.04%) when compared with the last month May.2015.

When compared with the corresponding month of previous year (June. 2014), the Stage Average Retail Prices of Wheat and Jowar were increased by 2.24% & 6.55% and decrease was noticed in Ragulu 1.10% & Bajra 2.72%. 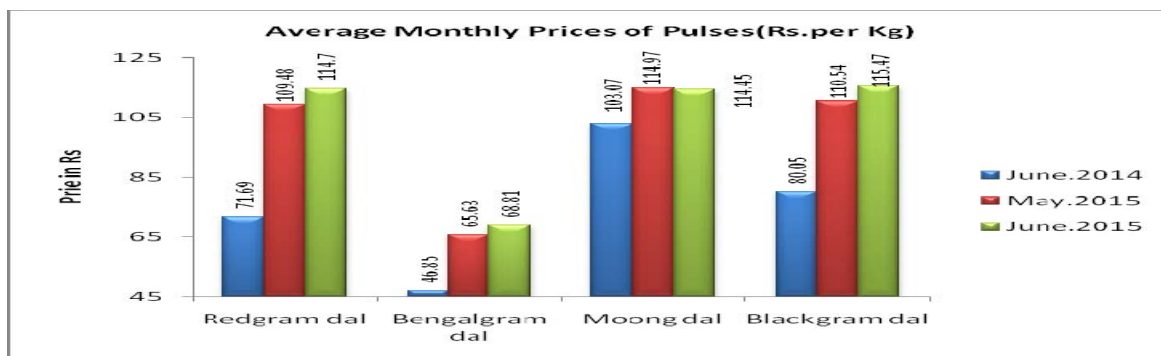
3.Pulses

Comparison of State average retail Prices of Pulses

During the month of June.2015, an upward trend is observed in the prices of Redgram dal (4.77%) Bengal gram dal (4.85%), and Blackgram dal (4.46%)and downward trend is observed in Moong dal (0.45%) when compared with the prices of previous month.

When compared with the corresponding month of the previous year state average retail prices of Red gram dal, Bengal gram dal, Moong dal and Black gram dal are shown an upward trend and increased by 59.99%,46.87%,11.04% and 44.25% respectively. 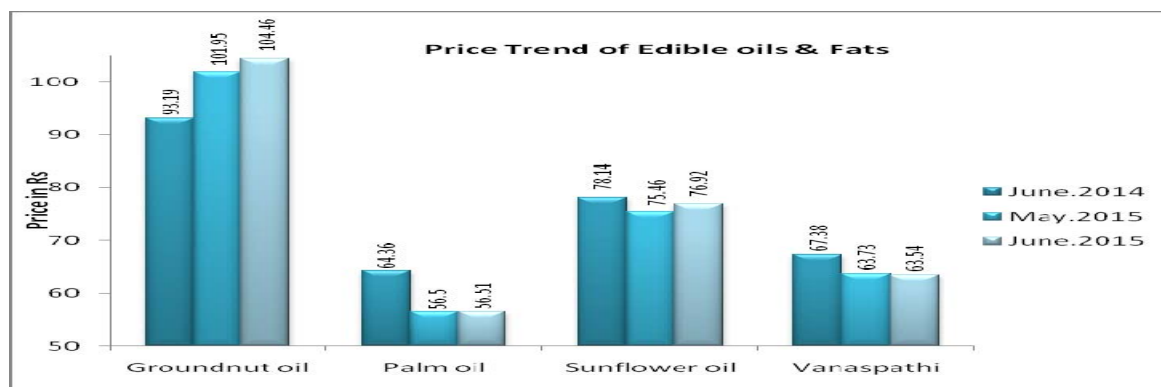
4.Edible Oils & Fats

Comparison of State average retail Prices of Edible Oils & Fats

During the month of June.2015, the prices of all varieties of Edible Oils is shown a slight increasing trend except Vanaspathi when compared with the prices of previous month.

When compared with the corresponding month of previous year, the state average retail prices of Palm oil, Sunflower oil and Vanaspathi are shown downtrend and decreased by 12.20%, 1.56% and 5.70% respectively, whereas the Ground nut oil has increased by 12.09%.

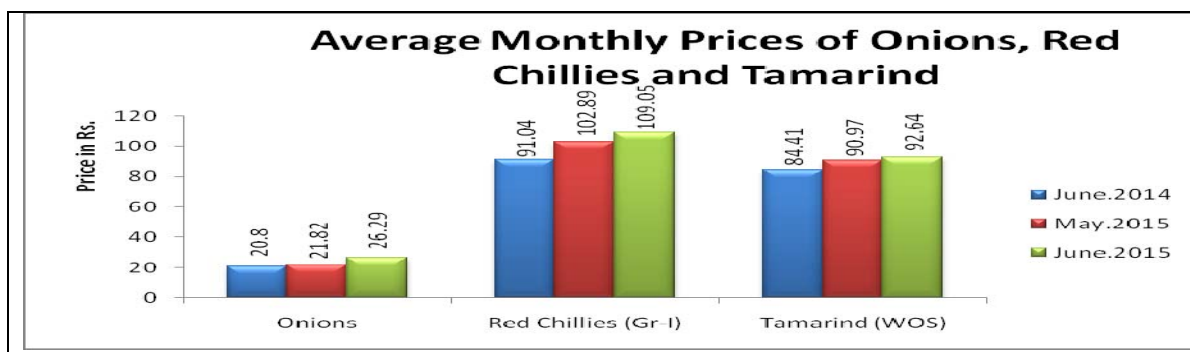
5. Condiments & Spices

An upward trend is observed in the state average retail prices of selected condiments & spices. During the month of June.2015 increasing trend is observed in the all prices except Salt (Iodised) 0.56% when compared with the prices of previous month.

6.Vegetables

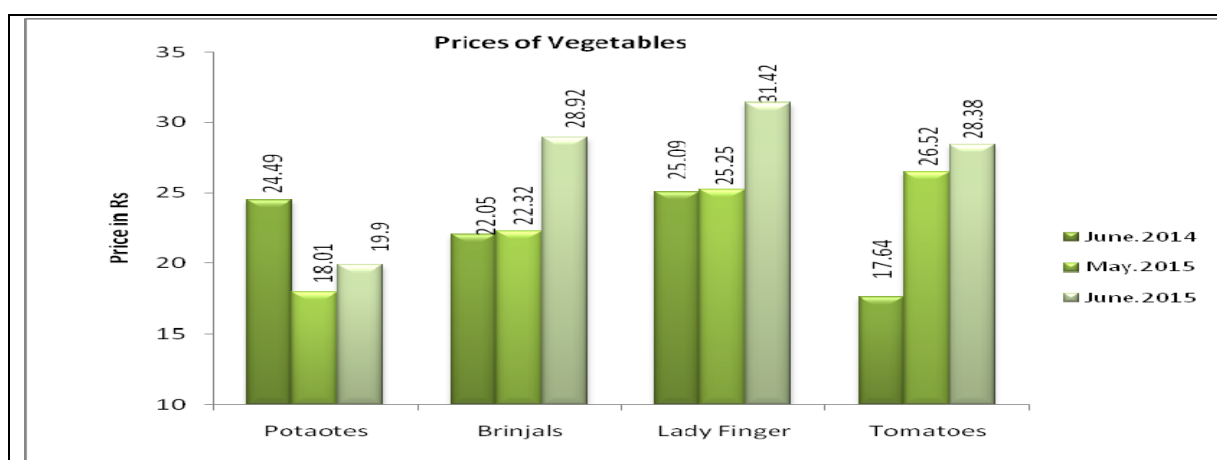
Comparison of state average retail prices of vegetables

During the month of June.2015, the prices of vegetables viz., Potatoes (10.49%) Brinjals (29.57%), Lady's Finger (24.44%) and Tomatoes (7.01%) are shown increasing trend when compared with the previous month.

The prices of Brinjals , Lady's Finger and Tomatoes are shown upward trend and increased by 31.16%, 25.23% & 60.88% respectively and Potatoes are shown downward trend and decreased by 18.74% when compared with the price of corresponding month of previous year.

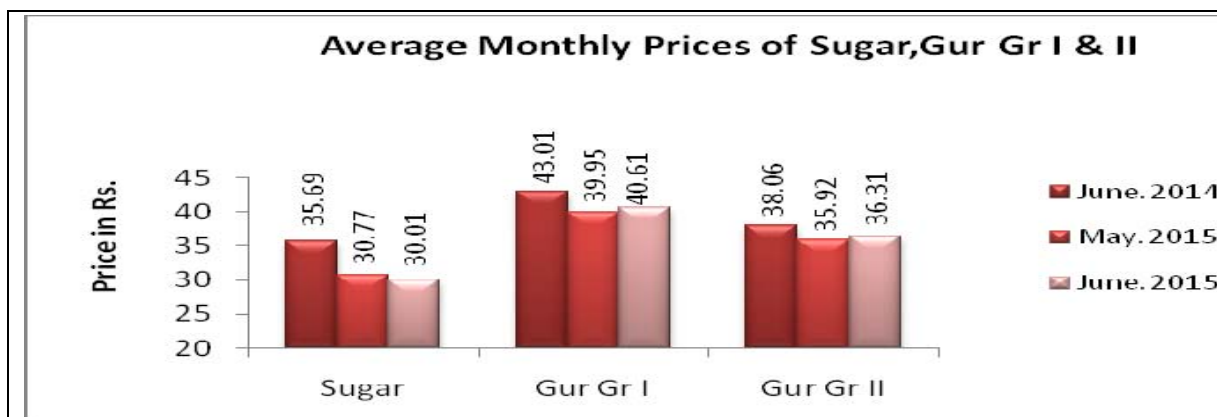
Comparison of State average retail prices of other food items

The state average retail prices of Gur(Gr-I) & (Gr-II) are increased by 1.65% and 1.09% and sugar is decreased by 2.47% when compared with the prices of previous month, May.15.

The state average retail prices of sugar, Gur(Gr-I) & (Gr-II) are decreased by 15.91%, 5.58% and 4.60% respectively when compared with the prices of corresponding month of previous year.

II. Consumer Price Index Numbers

The main objective of Consumer Price Index is to measure changes over a period of time in the level of retail prices of a fixed basket of goods and services consumed by a targeted group of people.

There are different consumer price indices compiled by different organizations for different segments of consumers namely, **Industrial workers (IW)**, **Agricultural Labourers (AL)** and **Rural Labourers (RL)**, **CPI for Rural Population**, **Urban Population** and **combined**.

1. Consumer Price Index Numbers for Industrial workers

Labour Bureau has been compiling and releasing CPI Numbers for Industrial Workers with base year 2001 on the last working day of the following month for each of the selected 78 centres at All India level. The following 3 centers are covered in Andhra Pradesh.

1. Guntur 2. Visakhapatnam 3. Vijayawada

On par with Central series, the Directorate of Economics & Statistics, Govt. of A.P is also compiling the CPI (IW) with the same base year 2001 for the following Complex centres as State Series.

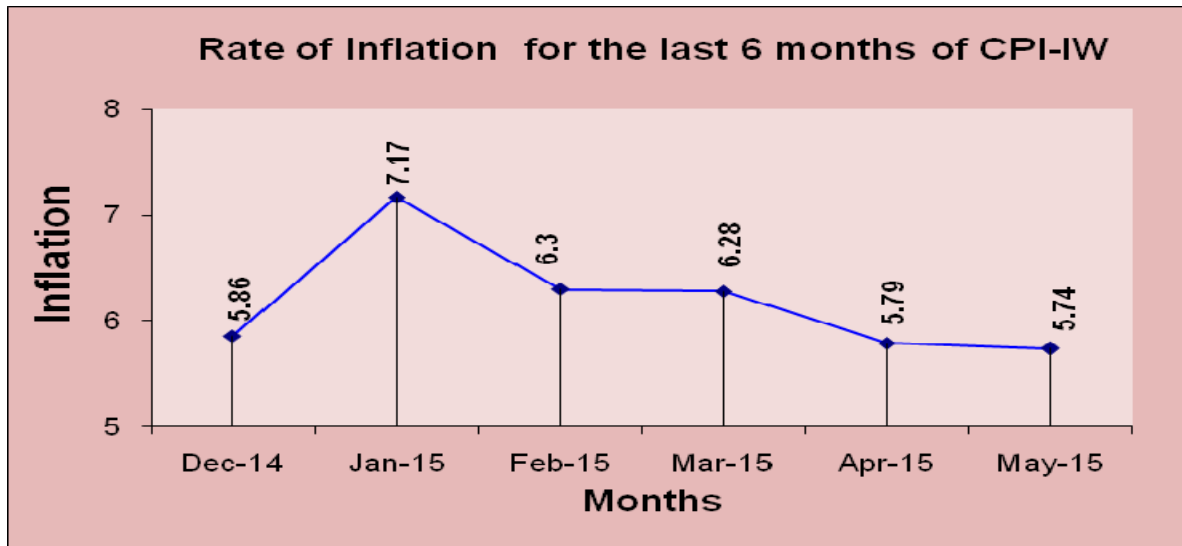

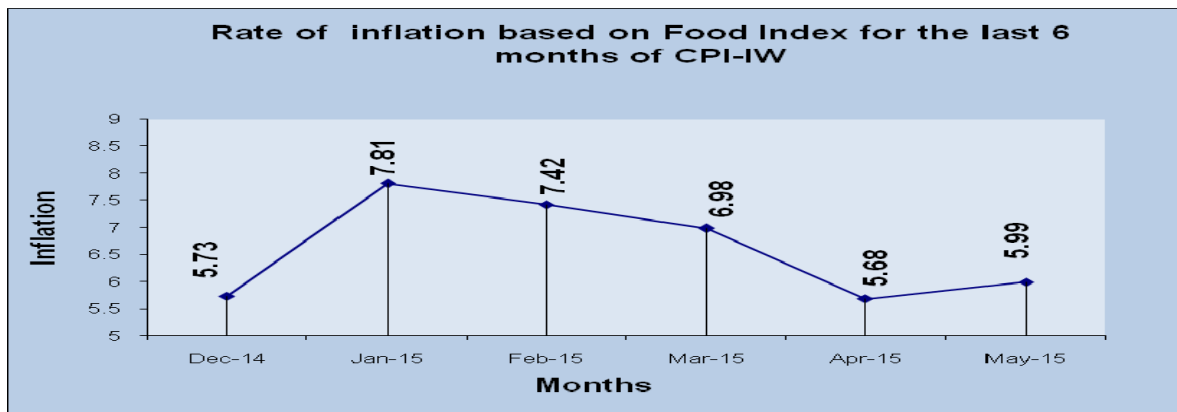
GENERAL INFLATION:-

The inflation based on CPI-IW (general) for the month of **May.2015** stood at 5.74% as compared to **5.79%** for **April.2015** and **7.02%** during the corresponding month of the previous year.



FOOD INFLATION

➤ Inflation based on Food Index stood at **5.99%** in **May.2015** as against **5.68%** in **April.2015** and **7.66%** during the corresponding month of the previous year.



Consumer Price Index for Agricultural Labourers/Rural

Labourers:

Labour Bureau has been compiling CPI Numbers for Agricultural Labourers since September, 1964. The existing series of CPI Numbers for (i) Agricultural Labourers and (ii) Rural Labourers (base 1986-87=100) replaced the earlier series on base 1960-61=100 w.e.f. November, 1995. For compilation of these index numbers, the Field Operations Division (FOD) of the National Sample Survey Office (NSSO) collects prices data from 600 selected sample villages in 20 States. In Andhra Pradesh 54 Villages are covered.

The All-India Consumer price Index Numbers for Agricultural Labourers and Rural labourers (Base: 1986-87=100) for May.2015 increased by 6 points and 7 points to stand at 811 points and 816 points respectively.

USAGE:-

The minimum basic rates of wages fixed are linked to the Consumer Price Index Numbers for the Agricultural workers. The Commissioner of Labour notified the Cost of Living Allowance for every six months on 1st April and 1st October of the calendar year.

For this purpose, the average arise in the State Agricultural workers Consumer Price Index numbers for the half year ending with December and June respectively shall be taken into account.

GENERAL INFLATION : The point to point rate of inflation based on

- CPI-AL decreased from **4.41%** in April.2015 to **4.38%** in May.2015
- CPI-RL decreased from **4.66%** in April.2015 to **4.62%** in May.2015.

FOOD INFLATION

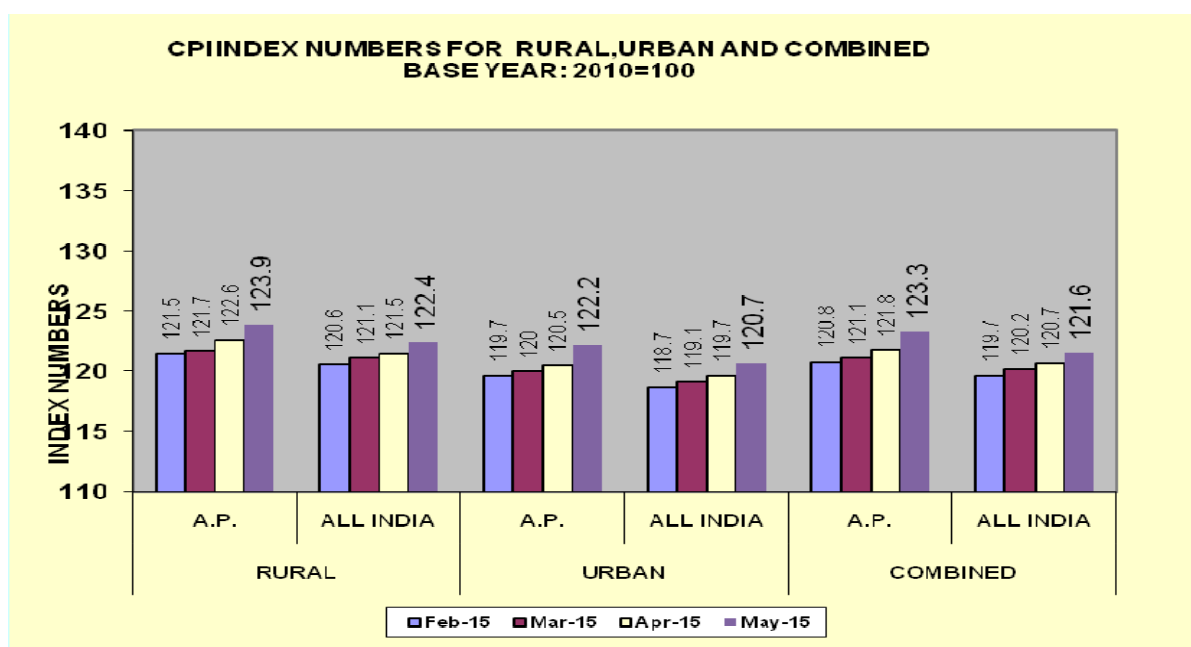
Inflation based on Food Index of CPI-AL and CPI-RL are **3.04%** and **3.29%** respectively during May.2015.

3. CONSUMER PRICE INDEX NUMBERS FOR RURAL, URBAN AND COMBINED

Consequently, The Central Statistics Office (CSO), Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation has revised the base year of the Consumer Price Index 2012=100 with effect from the release of indices for the month of January.2015

The CPI(rural, Urban, Combined)on Base 2012=100 is being released for the month of **May. 2015**. These new indices are compiled at State/UT and all-India levels.

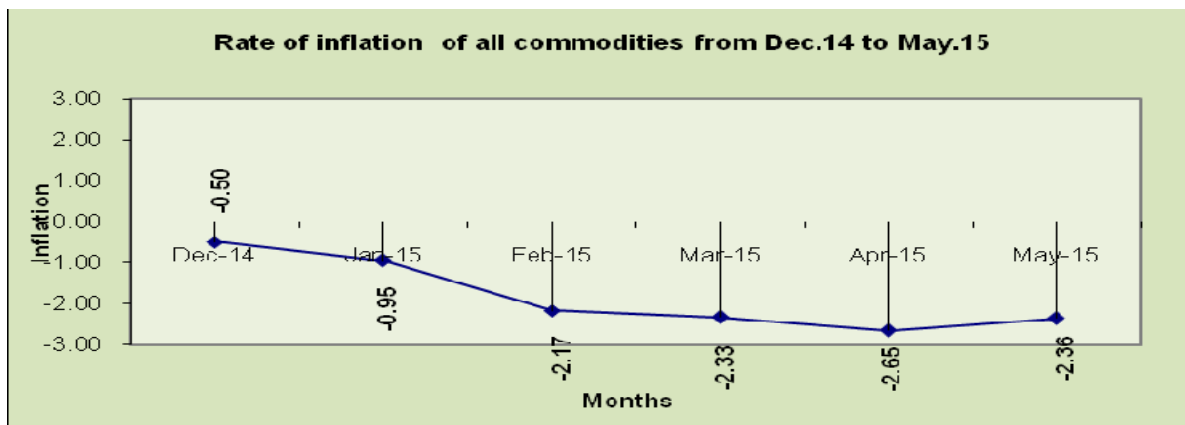
4. WHOLESALE PRICE INDEX (WPI)

Wholesale Price Index is compiled and released by the Office of the Economic Advisor, Ministry of Commerce and Industry on monthly basis. The WPI measures the average change over a period of time in the selling prices of producer's goods. The concept of wholesale price adopted in practice represent the quoted price of bulk transaction generally at primary stage, the price pertaining to bulk transaction of agricultural commodities(farm harvest prices/prices at the village mandi/ Market)and ex-factory prices for others. The base year for WPI is 2004-05. A total of 676 items are included in the WPI covering 5482 quotations.

The Wholesale Price Index for 'All Commodities' (Base: 2004-05=100) for the month of May. 2015 and rose by **1.0%** to **177.7** (Provisional) from **176.0**(Provisional) for the previous month.

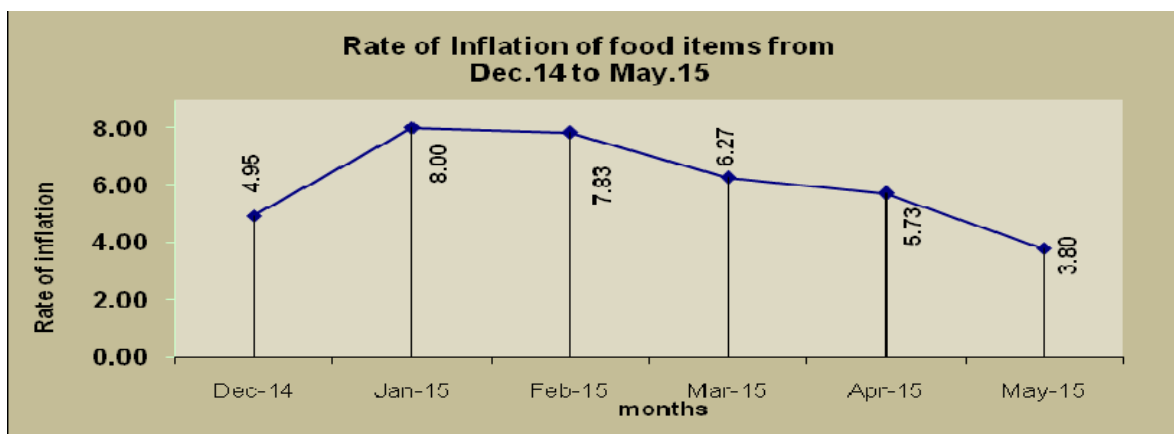
GENERAL INFLATION:

The annual rate of inflation, based on monthly WPI, stood at **-2.36%**(Provisional) for the month of May.2015 (over May. 2014) as compared to -2.65% (Provisional) for the previous month and 6.18% during the corresponding month of previous year.



FOOD INFLATION:

Inflation based on Food index is decreased to 3.80% in May.2015 from 5.73% in April'15.



FINAL INDEX FOR THE MONTH OF March.2015: (Base: 2004-05=100)

For the month of March.2015,the final Wholesale Price Index for “All Commodities” (Base :2004-05=100) and annual rate of inflation remained unchanged at its provisional level of 176.1 and -2.33percent respectively as reported on 15.04.2015.

7. WHOLESALE PRICES OF 40 AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES:

The wholesale prices of 40 Agricultural commodities are collected and compiled on monthly basis (last Friday of the month) with District as a unit and State average wholesale Price report is prepared . These prices are used to assess the price trends at wholesale centers. In addition to utilizing the same prices for verification of the market trend, they are also used for comparison with farm harvest prices and retail prices.
